Are bats birds?

Nope – they're **mammals.** They can fly like birds, but bats don't have feathers – they have fur like other mammals. And bats give birth to live young, unlike birds which lay eggs.

Do bats help people?

They sure do. They eats lots of **insects** – a single little brown bat can eat up to 600 mosquitoes in a single hour! Some kinds of bats eat **fruits** and drop the seeds all over to make new fruit trees that we then enjoy. And bats help to pollinate **farm crops** so there's a lot more food for everyone.



Do all bats eat the same thing?

No. Some like fish, some prefer fruit. But most bats like insects. Bats that like fish use their strong claws to scoop fish right out of the water. Those same claws allow bats

to hang upside down from branches and other secluded roosting spots.




Do bats drink blood? (Yecchh!!)

Are bats blind?

Nope – in fact, their eyesight works pretty well in the dark. But bats have even better hearing and a very special skill called **echo location** – the bat makes a squeeky noise and when it echoes back, the bat can tell what's nearby from the quality of the echo. It could be a tasty mosquito that the bat will then chase down for supper.

How many kinds of bats are there in the world?

Over 1,000 different kinds!

Do bats sleep at night?

No way. They begin their activities when the sun goes down and work hard

into the night looking for food.

They're very interesting creatures.

And like all the creatures that God has made, they have their own special qualities.
