## Promises Kept

Hundreds of years before the appearance of Jesus on earth, the prophet Isaiah spoke of what Jesus would do for us:

"But He was pierced for our transgressions,
He was crushed for our iniquities;
the punishment that brought us peace was upon Him,
and by His wounds we are healed." — Isaiah 53:5

Jesus would suffer and die for us, and then be brought back to life to give us peace and heal our souls. This would take place around the time we now celebrate as



EASTER. It was guaranteed to happen, and that's why Isaiah spoke of it as though it had already happened.

When God promises something, it's as good as done!!

We don't deserve God's blessings because we do so many wrong and bad things. But <u>Jesus</u> is good, and He can make us right with God.

At Easter, we remember that Jesus died for each person on earth, so that we could live one day in heaven with God, and have His help while



here on earth. We have that promise if we choose to belong to Christ — but without Him, we have nothing to look forward to.

It's good to remember God's promises. His promises help us to feel better when we're upset, or depressed, or suffering.

And the LORD has declared this day that you are his people, his treasured possession as he promised, and that you are to keep all his commands.  — Deuteronomy 26:18	Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.  – John 14:27	Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins.
