to take us there. So just step inside.


Let's set the date dial for, say, a couple of thousand years ago. The place: **Jerusalem**. Ready, set, and we're off!

There's a group of people all chattering and excited about something. What are they saying?


Something about a man. **A man who died but seems to have escaped from his burial tomb.**
