The Lord Jesus Christ once told a story about planting seeds. Here's what He said...



"A farmer went out to sow his seed. As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path, and the birds came and ate it up. Some fell on rocky places, where it did not have much soil.

It sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow. But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no root. Other seed fell among thorns,

which grew up and choked the plants.

Still other seed fell on good soil, where it produced a crop – a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown."

– Matthew 13: 3-8

Some people are happy when they hear about the Lord Jesus. But they don't read the Bible or pray regularly, so they never get to know

God very well. They are like a shallow soil that grows a spindly, weak plant. When trouble comes,

the plant just shrivels up.
